

National measures in the DR

- Procompetitive implementation of the TRIPS agreement
 - Preservation of the flexibilities
 - Capacity building of technical personnel, judges and attorneys general

Countermeasures

- Corporate backlash against procompetitive legislation
- Bilateral pressures against exercise of rights
- Generalized decapitation of diplomats
- Mixed efforts for capacity building

Priorities in Reichman's menu

- **Coalitions** - international, interest-based to support moratorium and private fencing of public interests
- **Active lobbying** in the developed countries to counter effects of regulatory capture leading to:
 - anti-development pressures;
 - negotiating positions;
 - new legislative initiatives; and
 - appointment of public officials with conflicts of interests.
